Dear Mr Burrows,

Bingham Car Parking

It is over a year since we presented petitions containing over 1,600 signatures in support of our concerns about traffic congestion and parking problems in Bingham. In September 2007 we presented to the Borough Council and in November 2007 Mr Suthers, OBE presented to the County Council.

We had previously pointed out our concerns about the lack of parking spaces in the town and the potential impact of implementing Civil Parking Enforcement without the creation of additional long stay parking spaces and schemes to prevent parking creep into residential areas.

We also raised concerns about the purpose of the scheme as the only measures mentioned in the documentation were financial and not based on safety or reduced congestion.

Disappointingly we have seen no tangible response to these concerns.

Even more worryingly the problems have become worse as a consequence of the implementation of CPE in May this year – an action taken by your organization. Streets around the town centre have become choked by displaced parked vehicles leading to angry protests from residents.

In addition to parking creep the town centre roads remain congested and bus drivers still have frequent confrontations with drivers of badly parked vehicles and are forced to divert from their scheduled route.

I enclose a document which includes our recommendations made to Rushcliffe Borough Council Parking Panel and which contains viable, long term solutions to the issue.

Will you please consider implementing these suggestions?

We expected our County Council to reduce parking problems – not make them worse.

Note that a similar letter has been sent to the Leader of the Borough Council as joint solutions are needed.
